Introduction

Initiate small talk with a lone wolf at your own risk.



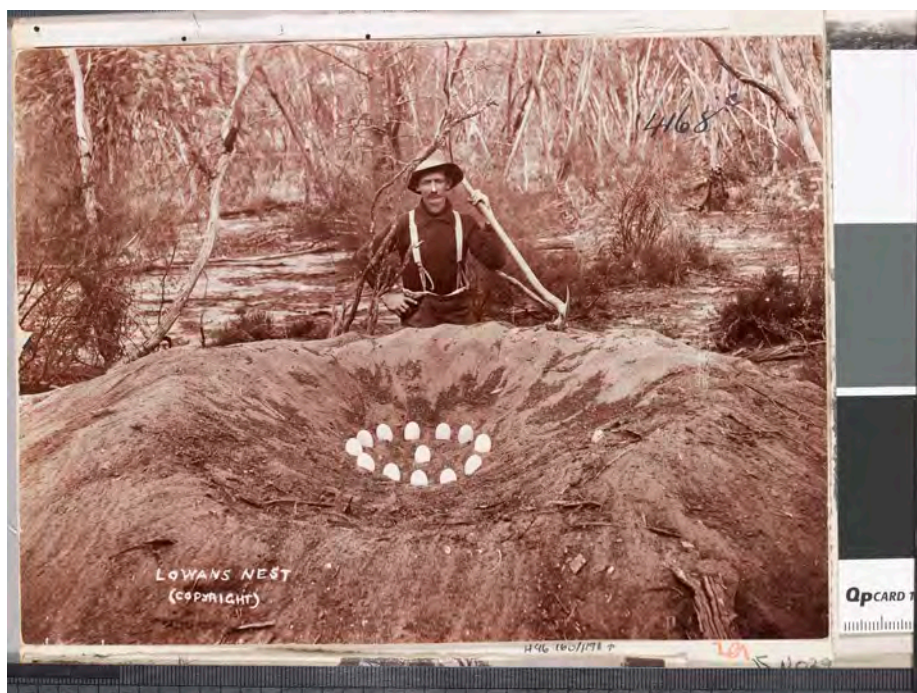
